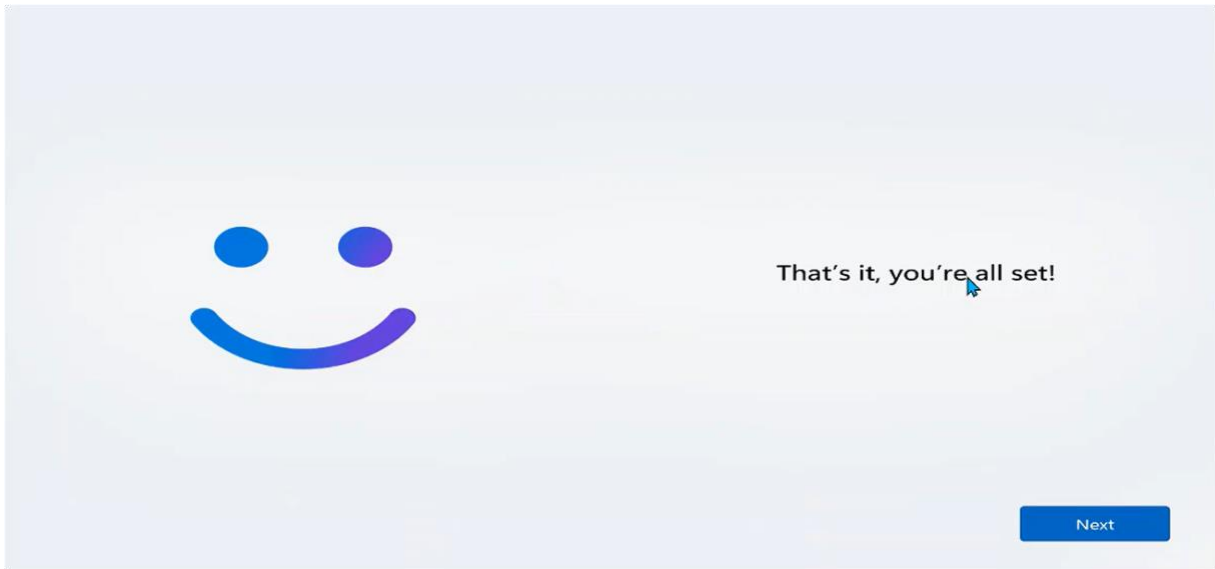

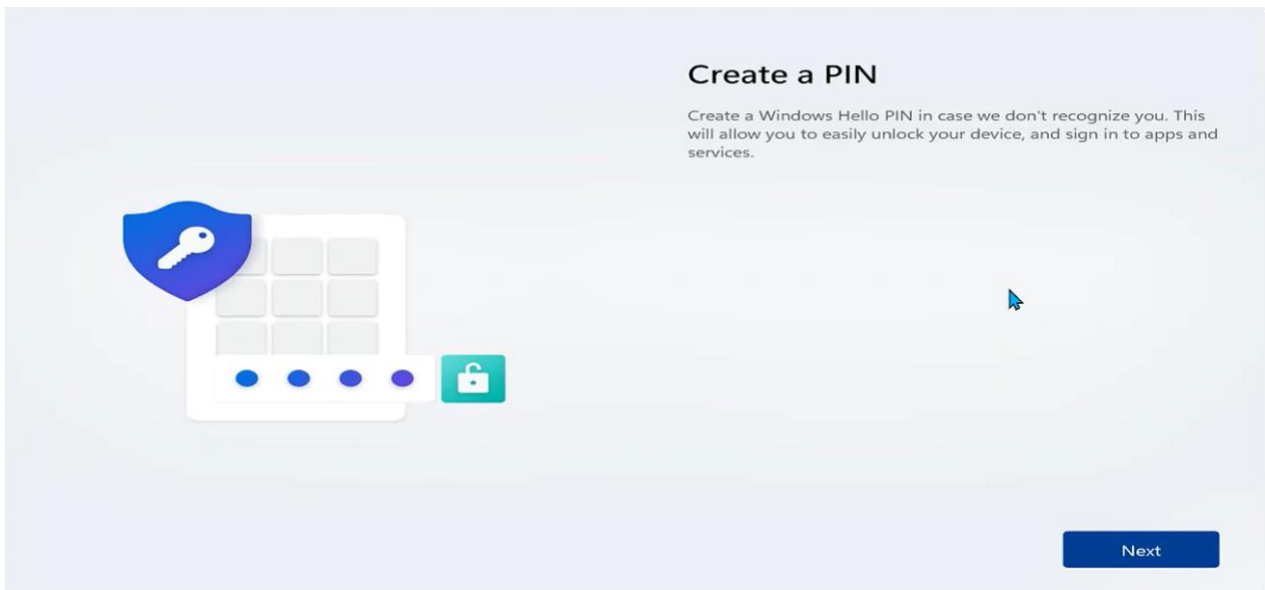


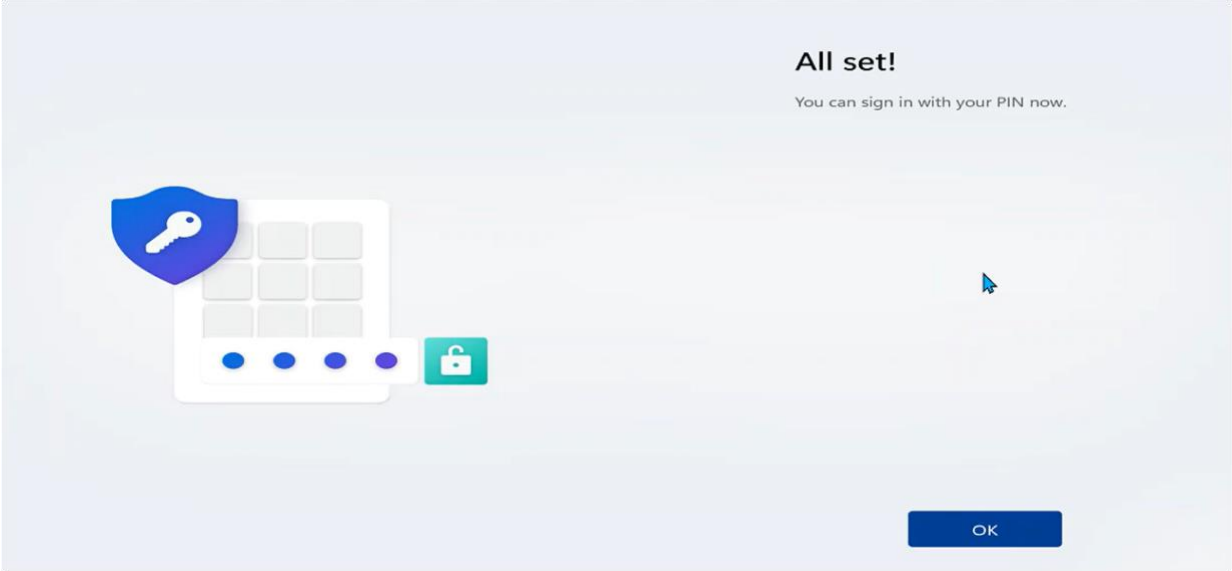
Create your PIN – The minimum is six characters. Microsoft's simple PIN algorithm checks for and disallows any PIN with a constant delta between one digit and the next. The algorithm counts the steps required to reach the next digit, overflowing at 10 ('zero'). So, for example:

The PIN 1111 has a constant delta of (0,0,0), so it isn't allowed

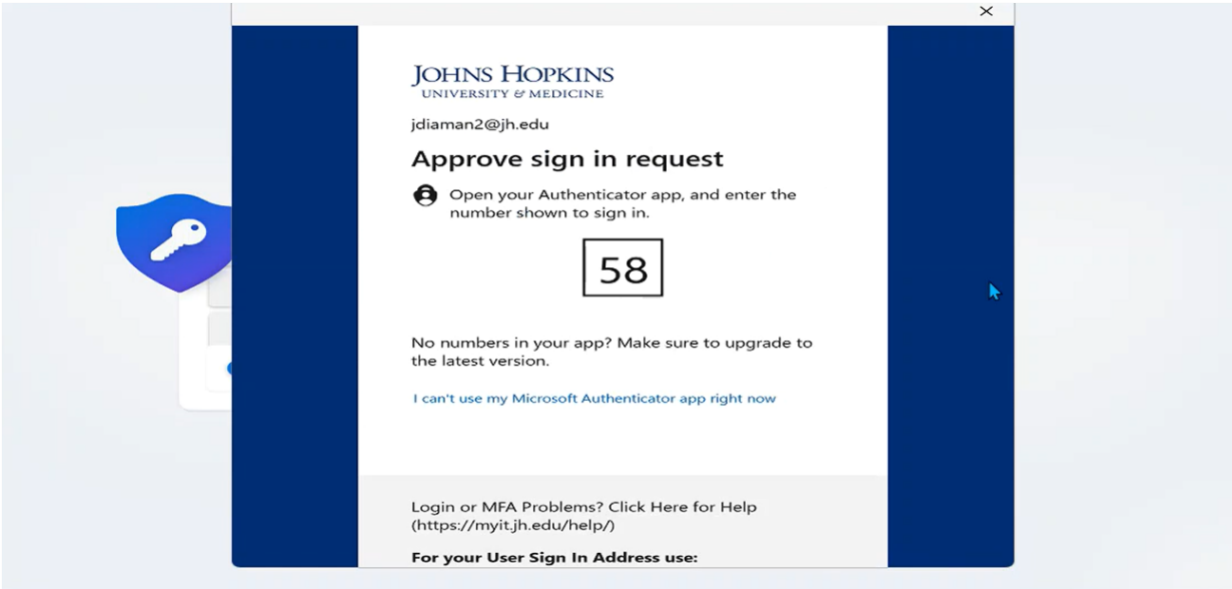
The PIN 1234 has a constant delta of (1,1,1), so it isn't allowed

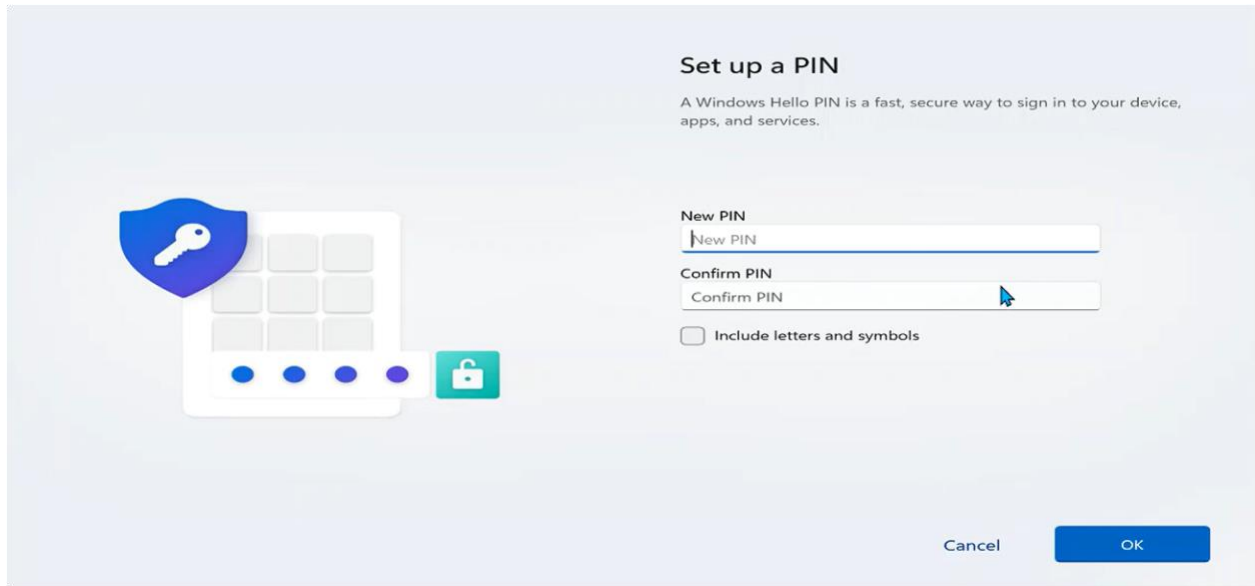
The PIN 1357 has a constant delta of (2,2,2), so it isn't allowed





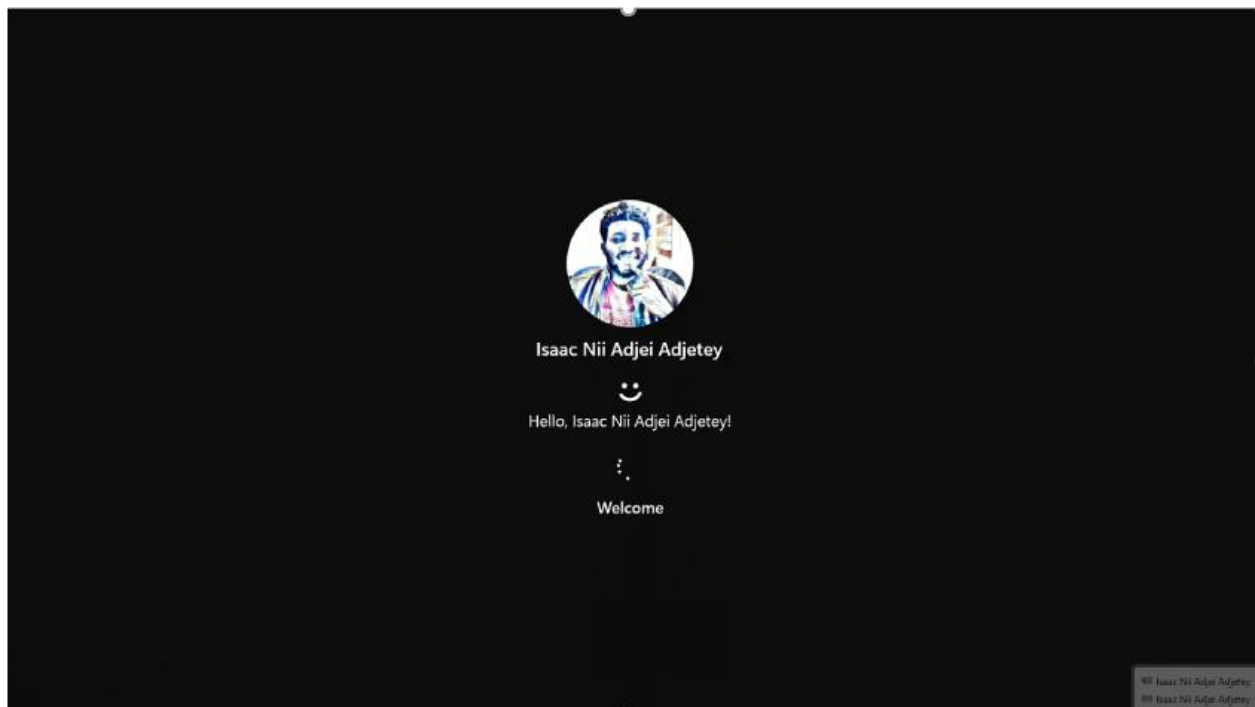
